"We're looking for scenic photos of creeks that capture the natural beauty and life found in our Sacramento County creeks and rivers," says Kerry Schmitz, manager of the Sacramento County Stormwater Quality Program. "In addition, the calendar will provide tips on how to reduce the amount of pollution that ends up in our creeks and rivers." The photo contest is open to all amateur photographers between the ages of 8-18 years old (3rd - 12th grade). Thirteen photos will be selected to be published in the 2010 Sacramento County Creeks Calendar. The winners will be credited in the calendar and receive a beautiful framed photo of the winner's entry, a screen saver featuring all winning photos, and copies of the calendar. Plus, the calendars will be distributed to hundreds of schools in Sacramento County. **The deadline to submit is August 12, 2009 and the winning photos will be selected on August 26.**
